- <u>1871</u>: BC joins Confederation with a promise of a railway to link them to the rest of Canada. Macdonald had a dream to create a nation from sea to sea.
- Macdonald knew Canada didn't have the resources to build a railway, so he offered incentives to wealthy business & railway owners to finance it.
- The only Canadian with the means to do it was Sir Hugh Allen, who joined forces with American rail tycoon Jay Cooke. In 1871 Allen forms the Canadian Pacific Railway (CPR), a seemingly Canadian company but actually controlled by Americans.

Pacific Scandal

- <u>1872</u>: Macdonald calls a general election. During the election the Conservatives realize they need more money for the campaign.
- Macdonald asks George-Étienne Cartier to find out if Sir Hugh Allan would finance the campaign in return the government would promise a guaranteed railway contract. Cartier wrote two memos, one promising Allan the railway contract, the other listing the amounts of money needed.
- Macdonald & the Conservatives won a slim majority, but the contents of the memos & the American involvement in the CPR became public. Macdonald was forced to resign.

Alexander Mackenzie & the Railway

- After Macdonald resigned, **Alexander Mackenzie** led the Liberals to power. He thought the railway was a waste of money and slowed work on it, even as B.C. threatened to secede from Confederation. Mackenzie eventually allowed the CPR land survey to return.
- Building the railway through the Rocky Mountains would be difficult. Sanford Fleming was
 chosen to lead the survey and multiple possible routes was debated in the "Battle of the
 Routes".

The National Policy

- <u>1876</u>: John A. Macdonald develops the National Policy as the basis of the Conservative election platform & they win the 1878 election.
- Macdonald believed the National Policy was essential for nation building. The NP included:
 - o <u>A System of Protective Tariffs</u> Macdonald devised a system of tariffs or taxes applied to American goods, making them more expensive than Canadian goods.
 - o <u>Immigration to the West</u> the government wanted immigrants who were farmers to produce & export grain and to buy manufactured goods from Ontario & Quebec.
 - <u>The CPR</u> the West couldn't be developed until goods & people could be transported in & out of the region.



Sir Alexander Mackenzie
