Jan. 30, 1933: Adolf Hitler is appointed Chancellor of Germany.

First concentration camps open within two weeks.

July 31, 1941: Preparations for the "Final Solution" begin.

July 1944: Russian troops liberate the first concentration camp at Majdanek.

Nov. 9/10, 1938: Kristallnacht, or "Night of the Broken Glass" occurs in Germany and Austria.

Dec. 1941: First extermination camp opens.

May 8/9, 1945: Last concentration camp liberated by Allies.

Germany surrenders to Allied Powers officially ending WWII and The Holocaust.
