Consequences of Colonialism

First Nations communities experienced many types of loss as a result of colonialism. Some of the main causes of these losses are colonization, racism, settlement, Indian Act, and Indian Residential Schools.

- Loss of children from communities.
 Loss of life due to diseases to which they had never been exposed to previously.
 Loss of land and resources which were the foundations of First Nations life.

- 7. Loss of opportunity and potential.
